REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMISSION:

Membership shall be by invitation. Two members shall endorse each application for membership. The appropriate fees in force must accompany the application at the time of application (Entrance Fee and Stock Fee). The application is then submitted to the Board of Directors for approval.

A member who withdraws from any membership class shall not be permitted to reapply and be accepted for membership until 12 months have passed from the date of withdrawal, unless said withdrawal was caused by a change in residence to another area. If less than 12 months elapsed, and upon payment of all monthly dues from withdrawal date to current date, the member may be reinstated. If 12 months or more have elapsed, a new entrance fee is required; however, the member will not be required to pay monthly dues accumulated during withdrawal period.

CLASSES OF MEMBERSHIP:

CLASS A - FULL MEMBER (Resident)

A person age 21 or over. Entitles the member and member's family (except family members over the age of 25 years old) full use of the Club. Member must pay Stock Fee of \$300.00, Entrance Fee of \$400.00, Monthly Dues of \$80.00 and a monthly spending minimum of \$30.00 in the dining room or snack bar for food and drink.

The stock certificate of a husband and wife may be issued in the name of the husband or in the name of both the husband and wife. Upon application for membership by a husband and wife (or a request for change in a certificate), stock shall be issued in joint tenancy in common, naming the spouses as members. If the stock is issued in tenancy in common or joint tenancy to a husband and wife, only one of said husband and wife can vote a share of stock at any meeting of the Club. If the share of stock is issued to a husband and wife in joint tenancy or tenancy in common, both the husband and wife shall be obligated for all charges or expenses incurred at the Club by either husband or wife or other persons charging on account of that membership.

SOCIAL PLUS MEMBER: (Non-Golfing)

A person age 21 or over. Entitles the member and member's family (except family members over the age of 25 years old) use of the tennis courts, swimming pool and Clubhouse functions.

Social Plus members have no privileges to use the golf course, except as specified in the Country Club Rules and other conditions as the Board of Directors may from time to time impose, including, but not limited to the payment of User Fees.

Member must pay an entrance fee of \$150.00, monthly dues of \$60.00 with a minimum food charge of \$30.00 to be used in the dining room or snack bar for food and drink. There will be no stock or voting rights for Social Plus Members.

SOCIAL MEMBER: (Non-Golfing)

A person age 21 or over. Entitles the member and member's family (except family members over the age of 25) use of the Clubhouse functions. Social Members have no privileges to use the golf course, the tennis courts, or swimming pools, except as specified in the Country Club Rules and other conditions as the Board of Directors may from time to time impose, including, but not limited to the payment of User Fees.

Member must pay an entrance fee of \$150.00, monthly dues of \$40.00 with a minimum food charge of \$30.00 to be used in the dining room or snack bar for food and drink. There will be no stock or voting rights for Social Members.

The dining room and lounge hours change during the winter months. Please call for reservations. Members may also order take out from the Club. Orders must be placed by given times. (See current bulletin for given times).

The monthly minimum spending for the club is \$30.00 per month, which applies to food and beverage in the Dining Room or Snack Bar.

Payment of all charges shall be due on receipt of the Club statement. Charges not paid in full within thirty (30) days from the billing date shall be considered delinquent.

DELINQUENT POLICY - Anyone who receives a 60-day letter and then allows his balance to become 90 plus days past due shall be suspended from the Club. The account must then be made current before the suspension will be removed. Once a member has been suspended he must then keep his account current at all times.

CASH WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED at the Nevada Country Club. Guest's charges will be the responsibility of the Club Member.

Members may bring guests to the club to eat. Guests may live in Vernon County. Guest must be in good standing with Nevada Country Club. Appropriate dress attire for the clubhouse is requested.

GENERAL CLUB RULES

It is expected that members and their guests will not reprimand employees.

Complaints regarding employees should be made to the manager or to the Chairman of the House Committee.

Advance reservations should be made for all Club affairs.

Member must sign their name and write their club number on all tickets. All food and bar purchases, greens fees and cart rentals must be charged. NO CASH WILL BE ACCEPTED.

The Club shall not be responsible for loss or damage to property of members or guests.

Any property of the Club damaged by a member or his guest shall be paid for by the member.

All accidents involving injury to persons or damage to property shall be reported to the Manager immediately.

No foods or beverages of any kind may be brought on the premises except as authorized by the Board of Directors or General Manager.

Members shall not require employees to leave the premises for any purpose.

Animals shall not be brought anywhere on Club Property.

Solicitation or advertising of any kind on the premises is prohibited without the consent of the Board of Directors.

No member or guest shall remove from the premises anything belonging to the Club.

Interior furniture shall not be moved from the clubhouse.

The wearing of spike shoes is not permitted in the clubhouse (Upstairs)

No drinks shall be carried from the clubhouse unless in paper containers. All containers and other debris shall be deposited in trash cans provided for that purpose.

No article or material shall be placed on Club property or improvements or alterations made to the Club House or the grounds, even though no expense is involved to the Club, without the prior approval of the Board of Directors.

The convenience and enjoyment of all the members and guests is best served by observation of the by-laws and Club rules. You are encouraged to report violations.

Annual financial reports will be available at the clubhouse for any member to pick up the Thursday prior to the Annual Stockholders Meeting. The reports will not be mailed to each stockholder.

Additional Rules as are deemed necessary for the operation of the Club may from time to time be posted and such posting will be considered a sufficient promulgation of a rule.

Clubhouse Rental Policies & Procedures

Although the Board of Directors recognizes the need to offer clubhouse facilities to non-members as a means of increasing income and to attract potential members, the Board believes its first responsibility rests with meeting the needs of NCC members. As a result, these policies and procedures are herein adopted to effect these goals:

Rental Fees: All non-members will be required to prepay a facility rental fee when full dining facilities are closed to members. This fee is non-refundable and payable upon reservation. At all times, efforts should be made by management to provide minimal dining space for members with members encouraged to make reservations during these events.

Sponsorship: Non-members must secure written sponsorship by at least one NCC member prior to reserving space. By sponsoring a non-member, the member accepts full financial responsibility for charges incurred by the non-member and guests.

Rental Agreement: the club manager, renting party, and sponsor will execute a facility rental agreement, completed upon reservation. This agreement will establish pricing of room charges, quoted food and beverage cost, and date and time of the function. For each function, a minimum number of guests (or minimum fee) will be established regardless of actual anticipated attendees. The date to specify this minimum is at the sole discretion of the Club Manager. All food and beverage items will be provided by the Nevada Country Club. No food or beverage items may be brought on the NCC premises without express written consent of the Club Manager.

Manager's Responsibility: The manager will ensure that pricing for each event covers cost of goods and labor, facilities are available on agreed upon dates, and that the rental agreement is properly executed.

NCC Members: NCC members will not be charged rental fees for private party use of clubhouse facilities. For purposes of this policy, a member is defined as one, regardless of type of membership, who regularly pays dues to Nevada Country Club. Group reservations initiated by a member will not be subject to assessment of a facility rental fee. However, groups that include members and non-members for which reservations are not initiated by a member, will be charged a fee. The Board of Directors will address all grievances, which may arise from this policy, for final determination.

GOLF RULES

A. General

1. Golf course operation is under the supervision of the Golf Superintendent and the Golf & Grounds Committee. The Superintendent has complete authority for closing the course to all play or to carts. He may also close any individual holes that may be deemed unplayable. Signs will be posted on the 1st tee. If these signs are posted, there will be no practicing on any part of the golf course, including the practice green.
2. Rules of play shall be determined by the Golf and Grounds Committee, which will be responsible for their administration. The Golf Professional shall determine that the members adhere to the rules of play.
3. All members must register guests in the Pro Shop before teeing off.
4. Greens fees for guests of members are posted in the Pro Shop. The member must accompany his guest and the members must register the guest at the clubhouse and pay the fee the date of play. Under no condition shall a member send his guests to the clubhouse unaccompanied and expect them to be allowed to play golf without the member.
5. The player should ALWAYS follow rules of golf etiquette.
6. Proper golf etiquette dictates that slower groups should let faster players go through. Also, players should vacate the green and surrounding area immediately upon holing out.
7. Slow Players and players searching for a ball shall allow other golfers behind them to play through whenever there is an open hole ahead. Foursomes have precedence.
8. In the rough—play the ball as it lies, always.
9. Groups finishing the first nine holes - on the ninth green - have priority over anyone or any group starting play on the first tee. Anyone or any group just starting a round must let those coming off of No. 9 green tee off to start their second round.
10. All members should repair ball marks on greens. If you will take care of your own ball mark and then repair one more that someone else has overlooked, we can have perfect greens. Remember this is your golf course.
11. Please put all trash in cans provided for this purpose that are located at most tees. Do not throw bottles, cans or trash on the course. Our groundskeeper have more to do than to pick up after sloppy members.

12. If you are driving a car through Club property, you must yield to golfers wherever a hole crosses a road. Even though you are a member of the Club, the golfer still has the right of way.

13. Players are not to practice on the course. If you want to practice putting, there is a practice green immediately in front of the clubhouse. Practice iron shots to any greens are prohibited - there are no conditions whatever that justify this practice. There is a practice range South of No. 1 green across the road and a practice green just West of the tennis courts - please use them.

14. Parents should not permit small children to play on, or walk across, the golf course. Children under 14 years of age shall not play golf on Saturdays, Sundays, or Holidays unless accompanied by a parent. Children under 12 years shall be permitted to play if accompanied by a parent on weekdays, but they are urged to finish play by 5 p.m. Parents should determine if a child is old enough to seriously consider playing golf.

15. In all Club tournament matches, the match must be played within the prescribed time period, or one or both sides must forfeit.

16. Please play rounds of nine holes within two hours and rounds of eighteen holes in four hours.

17. Any players or groups already on the course in the process of playing should be given priority over anyone or a group just starting to play, at any other tee also. No one should break into the flow of traffic and interfere with those already at play. (Example: starting play at No. 5 tee when a group is already on or approaching No. 4 green.

18. Absolutely no dogs will be permitted on the golf course to accompany a member. There are no exceptions to this rule whatsoever. Dogs allowed to roam on the golf course are a nuisance and they should be kept at home.

19. Should a golf ball be hit into the tennis court area, golfers must please remove golf shoes before going into the area to retrieve their golf ball. Golf shoes will damage the playing surface of the tennis courts, which is the most expensive part of the court to repair.

20. Observe all signs posted on the course at all times.

The Greenskeeper, his assistants, and the Golf & Grounds Committee have been given authority to enforce these rules by the Board of Directors. You own as much of this golf course as they do - let's take care of it.

B. Golf Dress

1. Proper golf attire should be worn at all times. The following garments are not considered proper golf attire:
 - a. Halters
 - b. Short-shorts
 - c. Gym suits
 - d. Bathing suits
 - e. Tank Tops
2. Shoes should be worn at all times on the golf course, including the practice green and driving range.
3. Men must wear a shirt on the golf course at all times.

C. Local Guests & Non-Resident Guests

No resident of Vernon County who is a Social Plus or Social Member or a non-member can play golf on the Nevada Country Club course. However, each full resident member may invite a Vernon County resident to play golf - one time only - if that guest is seriously considering becoming a resident member of Nevada Country Club. The club member inviting him must accompany the prospective member, and he must be registered at the clubhouse and the fee paid by the resident member. Resident members may invite out-of-county guests to play golf provided they register their guest and pay their fee in the Pro-Shop.

1. All local and non-resident guests must register in the Pro-Shop before going on the golf course.
2. A member having golf privileges must sponsor all local and non-resident guests. The sponsoring member is responsible for the qualifications and conduct of his/her guest.
3. The sponsoring member must play in the same group with his/her guest, unless granted special permission by the professional.
4. A local resident guest may not play on the golf course more than one (1) time in any season.
5. Non-resident guests are not limited to the number of times they may play golf.

SWIMMING POOL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. ATTENDED POOL HOURS ARE 11A.M. TO 7P.M. daily beginning Memorial Day through Labor Day. Pool will operate on weekends only when school is in session.
2. EARLY SEASON HOURS are dependent upon air and water temperatures. If it is 73 degrees or more, the pool will open. If the pool does not open at 11:00, it may reopen at 1:00 p.m. for the rest of the day.
3. SOCIAL MEMBERS, LOCAL RESIDENTS, AND OTHER NON-MEMBERS must be accompanied by an adult member and pay a fee of \$4.00 for adults and \$3.00 for children 11 and under. The fee will normally be charged to the MEMBERS monthly bill. Local residents, non-members and social members may not use a guest privilege more than once per week.
4. VISITING RELATIVES (under the age of 18) may be issued a guest pass for a period of one week for \$7.50, SOCIAL = AND FULL MEMBERS ONLY. A similar pass is available for Golf, Swimming and Tennis for \$35.00 per week, RESIDENT FULL MEMBERS ONLY. THIS SPECIAL FEE MUST BE RENEWED FOR THE GUEST EACH WEEK during their stay.
5. AFTER HOURS OR NON ATTENDED SWIMMING IS PERMITTED. Check with kitchen staff members and sign for a key. An adult Social + or Full Member must be present. The pool must be vacated by 9:30 p.m.
6. THE CLUB IS NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR ACCIDENTS. Children are the primary responsibility of their parents. The pool attendant is not a babysitter. Parents are responsible at all times for children unable to swim.
7. CHILDREN SEVEN (7) YEARS AND YOUNGER may use the wading pool. They must be accompanied by an adult.
8. LIFEGUARDS WILL CALL A TEN-MINUTE BREAK at their discretion. Everyone must clear the Pool. Lap swimming by adults is permitted during this time period.

9. NO RUNNING OR HORSEPLAY WILL BE PERMITTED. Members and others who do not observe Pool attendants' warnings and these rules will be suspended from the use of the Pool. If a child is suspended for disciplinary reasons, the parents will be notified.

10. DO NOT USE THE GOLF COURSE OR PUTTING GREEN IF YOU ARE WET. Swimming or bathing attire is not permitted in the Lounge, Bar, or Dining room. No coolers are allowed in the Pool area. Restrooms, phone and snacks are available in the Pro-Shop.

11. THERE WILL BE NO RUNNING OR BAREFEET IN THE PRO SHOP. No food throwing or playing with food condiments is allowed. The swimmer must wear a wrap around towel when entering the PRO SHOP. Any deviation from this may be cause for suspension.

**TENNIS COURT
RULES AND REGULATIONS**

1. Resident members who bring social members, local guests or out-of-county guests **MUST** register their guests at the Pro-Shop and pay the fee before playing.
2. No spikes or cleats of any kind are allowed on the tennis courts (smooth sole tennis shoes only).
3. Wipe your feet before entering tennis court.
4. No bicycles, skateboards or other vehicles are allowed on the courts.
5. Please clean foreign matter from surface of the courts (a broom will be left in the courts for this purpose).
6. The fee is \$2.50 per day for guests.

PRO SHOP INFORMATION

The Nevada Golf & Country Club is a member of the “United States Golf Association”, and “The Missouri Golf Association.”

PRO SHOP HOURS

During the main season the Pro Shop will open at 8:00 A.M. The grill in the Pro Shop is open at 8:00 A.M. with various closing hours. (Check the Bulletin)

GUEST GREENS FEE

Weekdays	\$9.00
Weekend & Holidays	\$12.00

Member or reciprocal billing may pay for Guest purchase of Pro Shop items.

CARTS

1. Players must keep carts at least 50 feet from greens and all wet areas on the course. Carts are permitted closer to tees, but in no event should a cart be driven on a tee. All carts should observe special instructions, either by signs, roped off sections or by borders sprayed on the grass. These areas are the most expensive part of your course, and you should do everything you can to protect them.
2. Cart riders do not have any preference on the course.
3. Carts shall be operated in a safe manner at all times.
4. Annual trail fees for carts will be established by the Board of Directors.
5. All privately owned carts must be covered by liability insurance. The Club will not be responsible for accidents caused by private carts.
6. Owners of private carts are requested to please observe the rule adopted by the Board in 1994 which states: To operate a golf cart on Nevada Country Club Property & Golf Course the DRIVER MUST BE 14 YEAR OF AGE OR OLDER.

HANDICAPS

We will be using the GHIN, Golf Handicap and Information Network, for our Club Handicaps this season. Handicaps will change every month beginning April and ending in October; and will include handicap cards, alphabetical listings, and handicap rankings. There will be a yearly charge to the members of \$20.00 per person. Anyone wanting to participate in Club evens must obtain a handicap through this system.

POSTING OF SCORES

Posting of men's 18-hole scores (good or bad) will be done in the Pro Shop using a score card complete with adjusted scores and names. Women will post their scores in the Pro Shop. These should also be adjusted scores. If the Pro Shop is closed during the late evening hours, please post score the following day.

EQUITABLE STROKE CONTROL

The way to adjust scores with Equitable Stroke Control sets a maximum number that a player can post on any hole depending on the player's Course Handicap.

If you're out on a hole and pick up to speed up play, jot down the score you most likely would have made.

For Handicap purposes, you are required to adjust your hole scores (actual or probable) when they are higher than your maximum number you can post.

There is NO limit to the number of holes on which you can adjust your score.

**MEN'S
WEDNESDAY NIGHT
JACKPOT**

1. The Men's Wednesday Night Jackpot begins the first Wednesday night in April, after daylight savings begins; and ends in October, when standard time returns.
2. The league will use a Shotgun Start at 5:30 p.m.
3. Teams are picked according to handicaps.
4. Teams will play Scramble with two, three, or four men (depending on the number of golfers present) to a team.
5. Each man will contribute \$5.00, and prizes will be awarded to 1st and 2nd places, 2nd place prize depends on number of golfers playing.
6. Winter rules should be played in your own fairway. You may roll the ball with your club head. In the rough or other fairway you must play the ball as it lies.
7. Food specials should be made with the Club Manager one week prior to Jackpot Night.

COUPLES GOLF

This is a Club function that meets every Friday at 5:30 p.m. It usually starts on the Friday following the beginning of daylight savings time, and will continue through September when the Annual Couples Tournament concludes the season. Cost is \$5.00 per couple with awards given out twice per season; mid-season and the end of season. There may also be Night Golf events scheduled during the season if arrangements can be made.

LADIES GOLF ASSOCIATION

Each year, the Ladies Golf Association begins with an organizational brunch in April. The Chairman and Treasurer volunteer the previous Fall, so other committee chairmen are appointed at the organizational brunch for handicaps, prizes, rules, and calling. Dues of \$20.00 are collected during the meeting.

Weekly play begins the following Thursday. Morning play begins at 10:00 a.m., but changes to 9:00 a.m. the first of June. Evening play begins at 5:45 p.m. Ladies may play both morning and evening if so desired. There will be \$2.00 collected. \$1.00 will go for game, \$1.00 will go for putts. The first Thursday of each month the A.M. and P.M. players will play in a scramble and after the P.M. players finish, all will have a dinner meeting where prizes from the previous month's play will be given out.

Other activities include the Ladies Open Tournament in June, the Ladies Invitational in July, and the In-House Tournament in August. Lady Golfers are welcomed from other clubs and courses in the area for the Open Tournament and is followed by lunch and awarding of prizes. In August, the 18-hole in-house tournament is held. An end-of-season dinner is held and winners of the in-house tournament are announced and yearly awards are given out to the Ladies.
